

1. I, Rebecca Kitteridge, of Wellington, Director-General of Security, solemnly and sincerely declare:
2. That I was appointed Director of Security on 1 May 2014 (known as Director-General from 28 September 2017 when the Intelligence and Security Act 2017 came into effect).
3. That I did not work at the NZSIS during the relevant period of the operations that are the subject of this Inquiry. As a consequence, I have limited direct knowledge of the operations that are the subject of this Inquiry.
4. That I therefore arranged for inquiries to be undertaken within the NZSIS, and based on the information provided by those inquiries, attach at Annex A a list dated 26 April 2019 with details of all NZSIS personnel who were involved in:
 - (a) The operation in relation to Objective Burnham on 21-22 August 2010;
 - (b) The operation in relation to Objective Nova on 2-3 October 2010;
 - (c) The operation leading to the capture of Qari Miraj and his transfer to the NDS facility on 16 January 2011;
 - (d) The operations relating to Alawuddin and Qari Musa on 20 and 23 May 2011 respectively;
 - (e) The operation in relation to Abdullah Kalta on 21 November 2012.
5. I believe the list is accurate and correct to the best of my knowledge.
6. And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the Oaths and Declarations Act 1957.
