

INS CAUSALITIES IN KAHMARD

3. (SECRET// REL ISAF NATO) F6 reporting states that as a result of the 21 Nov 12 CF air strike in KARMARD, TWB INS have suffered three EKIA and two EWIA. The EKIA are reported as:

Abdullah KALTA PSR(sen)1

PSR(sen)1

, and



The EWIA are reported to be:

PSR(sen)1 who has suffered an injury to his hand and PSR(sen)1, who has suffered serious shrapnel wounds.

The wounded pers are believed to be in ZARAY BAGH village of BRAFAK and at least one body has been moved to BARFAK – that of PSR(sen)1.

(SECRET//REL_ISAF_NATO) S2 assessment: This reporting corroborates earlier LN reporting on the INS casualties taken on 21 Nov 12. It is LIKELY given the amount of casualties taken by INS, remaining INS will accelerate their plans to either return to PAK or hole up for the winter to avoid being targeted in a similar fashion. Any retaliatory attacks by INS are assessed as UNLIKELY. End assessment.



KAHMARD ANP OFFICER ASSISTS INS

4. (SECRETI/ REL ISAF NATO) Reporting indicates a KAHMARD based ANP officer is assisting INS. A TWB based national reported that he sources some information from an ANP officer named PSR(sen)1 who works at the ISH PESTA checkpoint, NFI. It was reported that PSR(sen)1 had INS ties and passed information to INS including ANP patrol strength and movements.

(SECRET// REL ISAF NATO) S2 assessment: It is a REALISTIC POSSIBILITY that this is misinformation designed to undermine ANP effectiveness in the area. It is also a REALISTIC POSSIBILITY INS have informants within the ANSF attempting to play both sides of the field given INS actively target ANSF in the NE of BAMYAN province. End assessment.


NDS REPORTING OF TWB INS GP AND CF KINETIC STRIKE

5. (UNCLASS) Reporting states Abdullah KALTA and 12 fighters armed with RPG, PKM and AK-47 were active in the area of SEYA LEYAK and KARIMAK on the 21 Nov 12. They reportedly blocked a road and were harassing LNs and demanding money. KALTA and his group were reportedly planning to attack ISH PESTA CP. The above mentioned INS were then targeted by a CF ISR Platform resulting in the following BDA.

The wounded and bodies of the dead were recovered to a residence in TWB.

(SECRET!/ REL_ISAF NATO) S2 assessment: There has been some confusion over who exactly was killed/wounded in the strike. It is LIKELY the strike will increase LN perceptions of both ANSF and CF effectiveness in the NE of BAMYAN. It is LIKELY the attack will have created C2 paralysis at senior level for INS in NE BAMYAN as the network struggles to find a leader equally effective as KALTA. End assessment.



AO and AI Reporting PGOV SARABI IN INTERNATIONAL MEDIA

6. (UNCLASS) PGOV SARABI was interviewed by Frontier Post (A middle eastern distribution news paper) about her achievements as PGOV to date. SARABI cited road development as imperative to improving BAMYANs security situation and was complimentary of the cooperation she has had with NZPRT.

(SECRET// REL_ISAF NATO) S2 comment: The article was very positive in the way it portrayed SARABI and her tenure in BAMYAN province PSR(S)1
